

# Wythenshawe Safe Spots: Participatory Budgeting Event

The Wythenshawe Safespots was launched in 2014 in an attempt to tackle domestic abuse in the area and help victims seek the help and support they need. The project is led by local women from Wythenshawe, all of whom have themselves experienced domestic abuse. They have used their personal experiences to influence and negotiate with police, partner agencies and local businesses to set up and support the safe spots scheme.

From this work the Safespots team (SST) identified the need for services to be provided locally in Wythenshawe for local survivors. They worked to secure funding from GMP of approximately £50k and decided that this would be allocated through a PB event. This is where local communities vote for the organisations applying for funding at a public event and funding is allocated on the community vote.

The team required training on how to run and manage a PB event and this was delivered by MutualGain (MG). The training commenced in September 2015 when additional support was provided by PCSOs from GMP and the support worker from M4C. There were five support sessions that included:

- A vision meeting the Safespots team, MG & M4C and local organisations met to understand the vision that SST had for their Drop In centre – "what would an excellent domestic abuse service look like"?
- Four PB training sessions were provided for the SST with ongoing support by email and telephone


The SST agreed that the training and the support delivered by MG was outstanding. They agreed that PB was an exciting development in partnership work and throughout gave exceptional commitment to make the process work. They stated:

### "We learnt a lot from MG and we liked their style of training"

They thought learning style was relaxed and the relationship built with the trainers was very positive and the rapport was excellent ("even when we, the team were difficult"). They felt listened to and when conflicts arose they were dealt with firmly and in a professional manner. MG trainers did not judge the SST in any way, which made them feel reassured and want to attend the training. They particularly liked the way the trainers worked together and the use of humour to reinforce learning. They said it was clear the trainers were experts in the PB process as a team they believe they learnt a lot. As one team member said "it was bloody hard work but good fun and we would do it again but not next week".
